The ASTTP is a dynamic, hands-on training program designed to equip school employees, individual private citizens and law enforcement officers with the knowledge and skills required to successfully end an active threat event. This is NOT the standard Federal Active Shooter Response Program, this is a program of instruction that will prepare you to **Go To The Fight** and end the event through the use of deadly force. The ASTTP will prepare you to employ Active Shooter Threat Tactics through dynamic, interactive drills and scenario based training. This intensive and challenging program covers a variety of tactical subjects for responding persons including: Single Person Response Tactics, Limited Penetration Tactics, Tactical Medical Training, Multiple Person Response, Link-Up Procedures and Post Shooting Considerations. Candidates will be evaluated on their ability to perform skills and tactics in the role of an armed responder during live fire training and practical exercises. Several of the scenarios in this course will be facilitated with man marking rounds and firearms conversion kits from UTM provided by SMTC.

Ammunition requirements:

-Handgun - 1000 rounds.

Prerequisites:

1. Applicant must have no criminal history that would prevent them from owning or operating a firearm.
2. Must be able to participate in intensive training lasting up to ten hours per day.
3. Must be in good physical condition with no medical restrictions.

Required equipment: Handgun; calibers 9mm or higher is suitable for this course, belt-mounted holster, three (3) extra handgun magazines or speed loaders, appropriate eye, ear, knee and elbow protection; clothing suitable for weather conditions, baseball style cap.
